# A Little Bit of Club Barbecue History By Tom Ochs

As it has been said before, I am a wealth of useless information, and this is some more, and it is rather amusing... especially when you consider the sources. I can tell this story now, as the statute of limitations are over, and the ones involved have since sailed over the bar...yes the one at the end of the river and in our clubhouse.

The annual pig roast started in the mid 70's when a couple who were members decided to have a pig roast at their house, an old Spanish winery, in Yountville and invited the yacht club members to participate. Well, with nothing better to do on Labor day weekend, about 100 members of the club decided to go their house and celebrate, complete with the pig being roasted in a pit, starting the day before.

Well, this was such a success, that the next year the same was held, and even more people showed up, blocking the road down to the highway. This was a bit more than reasonable, so the third year the roast was held at the club, complete with a hole excavated in the north lot, and the fire started.

The fire department didn't take kindly to this, but they decided to let the festivities continue and said no more. A bunch of them also joined in the feast. The next year, it looked as if the pig roast was to be scratched, but some enterprising commodore suggested that we get a barbecue and roast the pig that way, which had now become a tradition.

At the time, we wondered, where were we going to obtain/commandeer an appliance so large as to roast a 200 pound pig. One member, worked in the iron shop at, you guessed it, Mare Island, and drew up a set of plans, and suggested that it be made over at the Big Store. I'm not sure of all of the details, but, after a round or two at the bar, the plan was set in motion by the usual suspects.

The barbecue was built, and set outside of the shop, and this was not an unusual project, as more than one of these had been built for the island before. With no tags or paperwork, it sat there until a plan could be devised to get it to the club, past marine guard in the security area of the yard and off of the base past another marine posted at the gate and to the club.

Now, one of our members worked for the Post Office delivering packages to the Mare Island Post Office, driving on and off of the base. He suggested, that he drive the truck, on the way back from his daily run, to the iron shop, have it loaded into the mail truck, and delivered, special delivery to the yacht club.

Also of note, this thing weighs upward of 400 pounds.

The truck was given a special pass, went the iron shop where the barbecue was forklifted into the back of the truck and off the base, to the yacht club where about eight members were waiting to offload it.

So that is how we got this piece of surplus equipment. It immediately went into service roasting pigs, and other items. That happened about fifty years ago and that is how our pig roast and watched started.

In the next couple of issues I will come up with some stories about the pig watch, like how we tried to burn the dock down, and what CO2 tastes like on the outside of a roasted pig.

As word has it, the barbecue is under going renovation and being cleaned up for future use after our galley was rebuilt. It will be used again for its original purpose, that is a pig roast on labor day and fun at the club.
