This month's safety tip is brought to you by Past Commodore Ken Leslie.

Protect yourself when doing the simplest projects.

Over the years, your yellow Marinco shore power cord has been subjected to everything the weather and dock can throw at it. Bright yellow and shiny when purchased, it's probably gotten dirty and sticky to the touch, not something you particularly want to handle, and it leaves black marks on your shiny deck. You will find there are many marine-focused vinyl cleaners available, along with chemical and abrasive cleaners from the local hardware store. None work particularly well. And with 50 feet of cord to clean, you want something quick and effective. Enter acetone. To keep yourself safe, use some rubber gloves-the industrial type, not the disposable type, as acetone will dissolve thin vinyl or rubber. Be careful to avoid breathing the fumes as exposure can

cause headaches, nausea, and lightheadedness. The fumes can also irritate eyes, nose, and throat. Also wear protective glasses to avoid drops getting into your eyes.

Gather a bunch of small rags. Soak a rag in acetone and wipe a short section of cord clean before the acetone evaporates. Multiple rags and multiple soakings will make short work of all 50 feet of cord. This will leave the cord surface clean but dry and dull looking, open to contamination. To protect the surface, apply 3M Ultra Performance Paste Wax over the entire length, buffing it to a shine when the wax dries. The cord will now look and feel like new with a minimum of time and expense.

In short, take care of your power cord. And make sure it is secured so that it doesn't fall in the water or become a trip hazard.
