### Recreational Boaters of California (RBOC) News

RBOC and BoatU.S. emphasize the original purpose of AIS

RBOC and our national advocacy partner BoatU.S. are emphasizing the original objective of automatic identification systems [AIS] to enhance maritime security following 9/11 as discussions are held regarding the potential expansion of the mandate to recreational vessels.

The Los Angeles\Long Beach Harbor Safety Committee may consider the placement of a recommendation in Chapter 10 of the Harbor Safety Plan that small commercial vessels and pleasure vessels be equipped with an AIS.

It is our understanding that the proposal is for AIS to be recommended rather than mandated in the Harbor Safety Plan. Even so, it is important to acknowledge that the mandate for commercial vessels to have an AIS was established to enhance maritime security following 9/11.

Expansion of the existing mandate to recreational vessels raises a number of significant public policy issues including privacy considerations as well as cost and operational challenges. These warrant an early and broad conversation with the recreational boating community.

This will be the first weekend after the Daylight Savings Time change, with more light in the afternoon. As always we will be monitoring VHF channel 72 for safety and communications.

The Loch Lomond YC has a new guest dock with cleats instead of those 2X4s along the edge of the dock to tie to. On Friday evening, we will be joining Lock Lomond YC for their St. Patrick's Day celebration. The bar will be open at 6:00 PM for happy hour and dinner will be served at 7:00 PM. The menu will include corned beef and cabbage, soda bread, and dessert all for \$18.00 per person. They are trying to arrange Irish Dancers for entertainment.


# LIGHTHOUSE ON MARE ISLAND SOUTH END, AND GHOST SHIP






Well, it's a new month and I have more useless information for you, and actually, this is quite interesting.

Last month I wrote about the lighthouse on the Vallejo side of the Mare







Kate became the second keeper and raised her four children there while tending the lighthouse for the sum of \$800 per year. Remember that this was in the 1880s. She had close ties to the city of Vallejo's social scene, so this was a lonely outpost for her at that time.

There were many efforts to make life easier for her, like adding a telephone, with poles and lines run by the Navy, to make her life easier. She was also provided with a barn and shed in 1888, hot water, a bathroom, a landing wharf, and her own personal horse and buggy.

She resigned in 1917 and lived out the remainder of her life there until 1932. Kate is interned at the Mare Island cemetery with her husband.

The lighthouse is gone, but the foundation remains and can be visited on the open space trail to the south end of the island.

The trail is to it is about a 1.5-mile hike to the top of the island, and at the top, you can visit the Ghost Ship, which is a memorial to those lost at sea in submarines mostly built at Mare Island during World War II. This Memorial is a free-form work of art, and the base features cutouts of the tools used to construct vessels that were built at Mare Island.

There is also an interpretive trail, or at least the last time I was there, that gives some interesting insight into the area, including the invasion of tule elk, about 1500 of them every spring, in the late 1800's.

If you go there, *bring mosquito repellant with you*. The view at the top is spectacular, as you can see five counties from it. The hike is a bit on the steep side but paved all way. The tail starts at the Mare Island Heritage shoreline preserve at the south end of the island.

So the next time you sail out of the channel, look to the high peak on the island and you can see this Ghost Ship. Also remember, artists put this together, and it is a tribute to those who have gone before us to make this land we live in, with all of its imperfections, the greatest place on earth.
